## **Adverse Media**

Adverse media otherwise known as negative news is any relevant information which is available through multiple sources such as online articles, press articles, blogs etc. and that may portray a negative impression, data or information on a person or entity. Adverse media is considered to be an important source of information when conducting the necessary due diligence and sanctions screening prior to servicing a client.

Adverse media may help uncover facts and guide persons' judgement prior to onboarding a customer or prior to the onset of a transaction or during the business relationship. Adverse media may shed light on multiple considerations in relation to sanctions such as the indirect ownership or control of companies and/or property of listed persons or entities or connections between a customer and third parties that may be violating or circumventing sanctions. The presence of adverse media is an important red-flag and such information should be positively considered in the assessment of a transaction or situation unless the information can be positively excluded to be false. In case of adverse media, the subject or non-subject person conducting due diligence is encouraged to consult various sources in order to corroborate the information.

## **Adverse Media**

Reference is made to the Guidance note on Non-Subject Persons linked hereunder which refers to the equal obligation on both subject and non-subject persons to ensure compliance with UN/EU and national sanctions at all times. The Sanctions Monitoring Board recommends that both subject and non-subject persons include adverse media in fulfilling their Customer Due Diligence obligations. Adverse media on a client can also impact a decision of a subject or non-subject person to continue the business relationship with a client in view of the negative reputation of the same, even though the information may be unrelated to sanctions.
